<u>Proposed law</u> provides for an exemption against <u>local</u> sales tax for prosthetic devices prescribed by physicians for personal consumption or use, when the patient is covered by the Louisiana Medicaid insurance program or a Medicaid insurance program administered by a third party on behalf of the state.
