SCHOOL EMPLOYEES RET. Provides relative to benefits for members of the Louisiana School Employees' Retirement System. (6/30/12)

1	AN ACT
2	To amend and reenact R.S. 11:1116, 1133, 1137, 1141(A), 1144(A)(1), (2), (3) and (4),
3	relative to the Louisiana School Employees' Retirement System; to provide relative
4	to membership, contributions, eligibility for and calculation of benefits; to provide
5	for an effective date; and to provide for related matters.
6	Notice of intention to introduce this Act has been published.
7	Be it enacted by the Legislature of Louisiana:
8	Section 1. R.S. 11:1116, 1133, 1137, 1141(A), 1144(A)(1), (2), (3) and (4) are hereby
9	amended and reenacted as follows:
10	§1116. Membership compulsory for employees employed after August 1, 1962
11	All persons who become employees, as defined in R.S. 11:1002, on or after
12	August 1, 1962, may become members of this system during the first ninety calendar
13	days immediately following the date of employment, and shall become members on
14	the ninety-first calendar day following the date of employment as a condition of their
15	employment. All employees Any employee who were was employed prior to August
16	1, 1962, shall be governed by and have the benefit of all existing applicable laws.

1	§1133. Credit for service as a defined "employee"
2	Any member of the Louisiana School Employees' Retirement System may
3	receive credit for service as an employee, as defined in R.S. 11:1002, provided credit
4	granted in another public supported retirement system covering the same time is not
5	in effect and provided he or she meets the requirements set forth below:
6	* * *
7	\$1137. Credit for service as an employee
8	Any active, contributing member of this system may receive credit for service
9	rendered as an employee, for which credit is not maintained in any other publicly
10	supported retirement system. In order to receive credit for such service, payment
11	shall be made to the retirement system of an amount calculated in accordance with
12	the provisions of R.S. 11:158; however, the member shall have rendered service as
13	an employee for a minimum of ninety days and shall purchase a minimum of ninety
14	days' service in order to avail himself or herself of the provisions of this Section.
15	The amount of service credit shall be limited to the actual number of days the
16	member was employed by a school board. Credit shall only be allowed for service
17	for which the school board maintained a record, and for which the school board
18	certifies the correctness thereof to the retirement system. All payments to be made
19	under this Section shall be paid prior to the effective date of retirement.

21	\$1141. Retirement benefits; application; eligibility requirements; effective date;
22	cancellation
23	A. Any member whose first employment making him or her eligible for
24	membership in one of the state systems occurred on or before June 30, 2010, may
25	retire upon written application to the board of trustees, if the member at the time of
26	application has attained the age of sixty years and has credit for ten years of
27	accredited service or has attained the age of fifty-five years and has credit for
28	twenty-five or more years of accredited service or at any age with thirty or more
29	years of accredited service. Any member whose first employment making him

1	eligible for membership in one of the state systems occurred on or after July 1, 2010,
2	may retire upon written application to the board of trustees, if the member at the time
3	of application has attained the age of sixty years and has credit for five years of
4	accredited service. An application for retirement shall be officially filed with the
5	board when received in the office of the director. Retirement benefits shall become
6	effective as of the date an application for retirement is filed in the office of the
7	director or the day after the member terminates from service, whichever is later. A
8	member may cancel his application for retirement only prior to negotiating, cashing,
9	or depositing any benefit check including an estimated benefit check.

11	§1144. Retirement allowance; regular, minimum, and supplemental
12	A. Regular allowance. Upon service retirement, a member shall receive an
13	allowance which, with the exception of the minimum benefit, and, also, with the
14	exception of the supplementary benefit which benefits are hereinafter provided for,
15	shall consist of:
16	(1) An annuity which shall be the actuarial equivalent of his or her
17	accumulated contributions at the time of his or her retirement.
18	(2) A pension equal to the annuity allowable at his or her attained age
19	computed on the basis of contributions made prior to his or her retirement, plus the
20	sum of three hundred dollars; however, the referenced additional sum of three
21	hundred dollars shall only be applicable with respect to persons becoming members
22	prior to July 1, 1986.
23	(3) If he <u>or she</u> has a prior service certificate in full force and effect, a prior
24	service pension which shall be in the amount of one and one-half per cent of his or
25	her average compensation multiplied by the number of years of his or her accredited
26	prior service. The average compensation shall be the average of the compensation
27	for personal services for any five consecutive years of accredited service, at the
28	option of the member; and provided, further, that in computing the pension for prior
29	service credit, any annual compensation less than fifteen hundred dollars shall be

1	considered as fifteen hundred dollars.
2	(4) In the case of the retirement of any member prior to his <u>or her</u> attainment
3	of the age of sixty years, his or her retirement allowance shall be computed as
4	though he <b>or she</b> had attained the age of sixty years in accordance with the formula
5	herein above set forth in this Section.
6	* * *
7	Section 2. This Act shall become effective on June 30, 2012; if vetoed by the
8	governor and subsequently approved by the legislature, this Act shall become effective on
9	June 30, 2012, or on the day following such approval by the legislature, whichever is later.
