CORRECTIONAL FACILITIES. Provides relative to incarcerated women. (8/1/18)

AN ACT
To enact R.S. 15:892.1, relative to correctional institutions; to require the Department of
Public Safety and Corrections to undertake a planning process relative to women's
correctional facilities; to provide for legislative intent; to provide with respect to
providing services relative to the mental and physical health of incarcerated women;
to provide relative to incarcerated pregnant women; to provide relative to the
development of programs relative to incarcerated women; to provide relative to
transgender inmates; to provide with respect to management of transgender inmate
care; to provide relative to staff education, training, and development; and to provide
for related matters.
Be it enacted by the Legislature of Louisiana:
Section 1. R.S. 15:892.1 is hereby enacted to read as follows:
§892.1. Incarcerated women; transgender inmate; services; development
A. The legislature finds and declares that services offered to state and
private correctional institutions and facilities should address the unique issues
of incarcerated women based upon female specific health issues, social and
psychological needs, family commitments, and issues surrounding children. It
