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| 2 | To enact R.S. 17:81.1, relative to the construction or renovation of public school facilities; |
| 3 | to prohibit requirements for the construction of storm shelters; to provide exceptions; |
| 4 | and to provide for related matters. |
| 5 | Be it enacted by the Legislature of Louisiana: |
| 6 | Section 1. R.S. 17:81.1 is hereby enacted to read as follows: |
| 7 | §81.1. Public school facilities; prohibition of certain building requirements |
| 8 | Not withstanding any provision of law, rule, construction code, or policy |
| 9 | to the contrary, no city, parish, or other local school board shall be required to |
| 10 | construct a storm shelter as part of any new construction or renovation |
| 11 | program, unless funds for constructing the shelter are provided through sources |
| 12 | other than local monies. |
| 13 | Section 2. This Act shall become effective upon signature by the governor or, if not |
| 14 | signed by the governor, upon expiration of the time for bills to become law without signature |
| 15 | by the governor, as provided by Article III, Section 18 of the Constitution of Louisiana. If |
| 16 | vetoed by the governor and subsequently approved by the legislature, this Act shall become |
| 17 | effective on the day following such approval. |
