SENATE BILL NO. 41

BY SENATORS PETERSON AND MURRAY

SPECIAL DISTRICTS. Provides for the renewal of parcel fees for the Upper Hurstville Security District. (7/1/10)

1 AN ACT

2 To amend and reenact R.S. 33:9091.6(F)(3)(b), relative to a neighborhood improvement
3 district in Orleans Parish; to provide for renewal election of parcel fees for the Upper
4 Hurstville Security District; and to provide for related matters.

5 Notice of intention to introduce this Act has been published.

6 Be it enacted by the Legislature of Louisiana:

7 Section 1. R.S. 33:9091.6(F)(3)(b) is hereby amended and reenacted to read as
8 follows:

9 §9091.6. Upper Hurstville Security District

10 * * *

11 F. Parcel fee. The governing authority of the city of New Orleans is hereby
12 authorized to impose and collect a parcel fee within the district subject to and in
13 accordance with the provisions of this Subsection:

15 (3) * * *

16 (b) The fee shall expire eight years after its initial levy but may be renewed
17 if approved by a majority of the registered voters of the district voting on the

1 proposition at an election as provided in Subparagraph (a) of this Paragraph. Any
 2 election to authorize the renewal of the fee shall be held ~~only at the same time as the~~
 3 ~~mayoral primary election for the city of New Orleans~~ **for that purpose in**
 4 **accordance with the Louisiana Election Code**. If the fee is renewed, the term of
 5 the imposition of the fee shall be as provided in the proposition authorizing such
 6 renewal, not to exceed eight years.

8 Section 2. This Act shall become effective on July 1, 2010.

DIGEST

Peterson (SB 41)

Present law provides that the parcel fee shall expire eight years after its initial levy but may be renewed if approved by a majority of the registered voters of the district voting on the proposition at an election. Any election to authorize the renewal of the fee shall be held only at the same time as the mayoral primary election in New Orleans. If the fee is renewed, the term of the imposition of the fee shall be as provided in the proposition authorizing such renewal, not to exceed eight years.

Proposed law retains present law but changes the election date that would authorize the renewal of the parcel fee from the mayoral primary to in accordance with the Louisiana Election Code.

Effective July 1, 2010.
