EMPLOYMENT. Provides for a state minimum wage. (1/1/15)

1	AN ACT
2	To enact R.S. 23:643, relative to payment of employees; to provide for a state minimum
3	wage of ten dollars an hour; to provide for exclusions; to provide for an effective
4	date; and to provide for related matters.
5	Be it enacted by the Legislature of Louisiana:
6	Section 1. R.S. 23:643 is hereby enacted to read as follows:
7	<u>§643. Minimum wage, established</u>
8	A. The Legislature of Louisiana finds that economic stability and growth
9	are among the most important factors affecting the general welfare of the
10	people of this state and are, therefore, among its own most important
11	<u>responsibilities.</u>
12	<b>B.</b> Notwithstanding any other provision of law to the contrary, the state
13	<u>minimum wage shall be ten dollars an hour, effective on and after January 1,</u>
14	<u>2015.</u>
15	<u>C. (1) The provisions of this Section shall not apply to student employees</u>
16	as defined in State Civil Service Rule 1.5.1, and employees of state colleges and
17	universities.

1	(2) An employer may take a tip credit toward its minimum wage
2	obligation for tipped employees equal to the difference between the required
3	cash wage and the required minimum wage.

## DIGEST

Proposed law establishes a state minimum wage of \$10 an hour.

<u>Proposed law</u> excepts student employees as defined by state civil service rules and employees of state colleges and universities.

Proposed law provides for a tip credit.

Effective January 1, 2015.
