1	AN ACT
2	To amend and reenact R.S. 30:2483(E) and 2484(A)(1) and (7) and to enact R.S.
3	30:2486(F), relative to special treasury funds; to remove the cap on the Oil Spill
4	Contingency Fund in certain circumstances; to provide for the use of monies in the
5	Oil Spill Contingency Fund during declared emergencies or disasters; to provide for
6	the collection of the oil spill contingency fee during declared emergencies or
7	disasters; to provide for an effective date; and to provide for related matters.
8	Be it enacted by the Legislature of Louisiana:
9	Section 1. R.S. 30:2483(E) and 2484(A)(1) and (7) are hereby amended and
10	reenacted and R.S. 30:2486(F) is hereby enacted to read as follows:
11	§2483. Oil Spill Contingency Fund
12	* * *
13	E. After compliance with the requirements of Article VII, Section 9(B) of the
14	Constitution of Louisiana relative to the Bond Security and Redemption Fund, and
15	prior to monies being placed in the state general fund, an amount equal to that
16	deposited, as required in Subsection D hereof, and monies appropriated by the
17	legislature shall be credited to a special fund hereby created in the state treasury to
18	be known as the "Oil Spill Contingency Fund". The monies in this fund shall be used
19	solely as provided in this Section and only in the amounts appropriated by the
20	legislature. All unexpended and unencumbered monies in this fund at the end of the
21	fiscal year shall remain in the fund. The monies in this fund shall be invested by the
22	state treasurer in the same manner as monies in the state general fund, and interest
23	earned on the investment of these monies shall remain in the fund. Except as

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1	otherwise provided in this Section, the The balance of the fund shall not exceed
2	thirty million dollars, exclusive of all fees, other than all fees collected pursuant to
3	R.S. 30:2485 and 2486, penalties, judgments, reimbursements, charges, interest, and
4	federal funds collected pursuant to the provisions of this Chapter. As authorized by
5	Article VII, Section 10.7(C) of the Constitution of Louisiana, the amount of
6	monies in the fund shall not be limited to thirty million dollars during a
7	declared state of emergency or disaster caused by an unauthorized discharge of
8	<u>oil.</u>
9	§2484. Uses of fund
10	A. Money in the fund may be disbursed for the following purposes and no
11	others:
12	(1) Administrative and personnel expenses of the office of the coordinator,
13	excluding those of the oil spill technical assistance program, not to exceed six
14	hundred thousand dollars in any fiscal year; except that during a declared state of
15	emergency or disaster caused by an unauthorized discharge of oil, more than
16	six hundred thousand dollars in a fiscal year may be disbursed from the fund

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1	F. Notwithstanding any other provision of law to the contrary, the
2	<u>amount of monies in the fund shall not be limited to seven million dollars during</u>
3	a declared state of emergency or disaster caused by an unauthorized discharge
4	<u>of oil.</u>
5	Section 2. This Act shall become effective upon signature by the governor or, if not
6	signed by the governor, upon expiration of the time for bills to become law without signature
7	by the governor, as provided by Article III, Section 18 of the Constitution of Louisiana. If
8	vetoed by the governor and subsequently approved by the legislature, this Act shall become
9	effective on the day following such approval.
