SENATE BILL NO. 488

BY SENATOR NEVERS

POSTSECONDARY ED. Provides that certain rules adopted by the Board of Regents are subject to the Administrative Procedure Act. (gov sig)

1 AN ACT

2 To amend and reenact R.S. 17:3123(D), relative to the Board of Regents; to provide that
3 certain rules adopted by the board are subject to the Administrative Procedure Act;
4 and to provide for related matters.

5 Be it enacted by the Legislature of Louisiana:

6 Section 1. R.S. 17:3123(D) is hereby amended and reenacted to read as follows:

7 §3123. Domicile; organization and meetings of board; rules

8 * * *

9 D. (1) The board shall adopt rules for the transaction of its business and shall
10 keep an accurate record of all of its proceedings and official actions. All papers,
11 documents and records appertaining to the board shall be filed at the domicile of the
12 board.

13 (2) All rules adopted by the board, exclusive of those regulating only the
14 internal management of the board's affairs, shall be adopted in accordance with
15 the Administrative Procedure Act.

16 * * *

17 Section 2. This Act shall become effective upon signature by the governor or, if not

1 signed by the governor, upon expiration of the time for bills to become law without signature
2 by the governor, as provided by Article III, Section 18 of the Constitution of Louisiana. If
3 vetoed by the governor and subsequently approved by the legislature, this Act shall become
4 effective on the day following such approval.

DIGEST

Nevers (SB 488)

Present law requires the Board of Regents to adopt rules for the transaction of its business and to keep an accurate record of all of its proceedings and official actions. Further requires that all papers, documents, and records appertaining to the board be filed at the board's domicile.

Proposed law provides that rules adopted by the board, other than those adopted to regulate the internal management of the board's affairs, must be adopted in accordance with the Administrative Procedure Act.

Effective upon signature of the governor or lapse of time for gubernatorial action.
