2	To amend and reenact Section 7(B) of Act No. 333 of the 1972 Regular Session of the
3	Louisiana Legislature as amended by Act No. 56 of the 1987 Regular Session of the
4	Louisiana Legislature and Act No. 17 of the 1998 First Extraordinary Session of the
5	Louisiana Legislature and to enact R.S. 33:423.23, relative to the city of Kaplan; to
6	provide for the authority of the chief of police regarding police personnel; to provide
7	that the position of assistant to the chief of police shall be in the unclassified service
8	to provide for the authority of the assistant to the chief of police; and to provide for
9	related matters.
10	Notice of intention to introduce this Act has been published.
11	Be it enacted by the Legislature of Louisiana:
12	Section 1. R.S. 33:423.23 is hereby enacted to read as follows:
13	§423.23. City of Kaplan; authority over personnel by elected chief of police
14	Notwithstanding the provisions of R.S. 33:423 or any other provision of
15	law to the contrary, in and for the city of Kaplan, the chief of police shall
16	appoint, promote, discipline, and dismiss police personnel subject to the
17	budgetary limitations of the mayor and the board of aldermen pertaining to the
18	number of allotted positions for the police department. This provision shall not
19	however, prohibit a police department employee from making a direct appear
20	to the city of Kaplan's civil service board.
21	Section 2. Section 7(B) of Act No. 333 of the 1972 Regular Session of the Louisiana
22	Legislature as amended by Act No. 56 of the 1987 Regular Session of the Louisiana
23	Legislature and Act No. 17 of the 1998 First Extraordinary Session of the Louisiana
24	Legislature is hereby amended and reenacted to read as follows:

1	Section 7. Classified and Unclassified Services
2	* * *
3	B. The unclassified service shall not be subject to the provisions of this Act.
4	It consists of the following positions:
5	(1) The mayor,.
6	(2) The members of the board of aldermen;
7	(3) The consulting engineer.
8	(4) The city attorney,.
9	(5) The city prosecutor,
10	(6) The city clerk.
11	(7) The street commissioner,.
12	(8) The auditor employed to audit books or records of the city;.
13	(9) Any and all elected officials,
14	(10) All members of advisory boards and committees appointed by the mayor
15	and board of aldermen;.
16	(11) All joint employees of the city and of the state, parish, or federal
17	government, or any of their departments whose duties or compensation are partly or
18	wholly subject to the supervision or control of other governmental agencies, and.
19	(12) All all part-time labor which the appointing authority requests to be
20	unclassified and which is approved by the Civil Service Board.
21	(13) Eight The unclassified service shall also include eight part-time
22	employees of the police department, including not more than six police officers and
23	not more than two police dispatchers, who shall be paid an hourly wage and who
24	shall not be paid for more than twenty-four hours of work per pay period.
25	(14) The assistant chief of police. The right of selection, appointment,
26	supervision, discipline, and discharge for this position shall be vested in the
27	chief of police of the city and, in the absence of the chief of police, the assistant
28	chief shall have the authority to act as chief in the administration of the police
29	department. Any person who is appointed from a position in the classified
30	police service to serve as assistant chief of police shall not forfeit his seniority

accumulated to the date of his appointment and shall continue to accumulate

seniority during the time he holds the position of assistant chief of police.
