27	the public as such.
28	(3.1) "Air ambulance service" means any person, firm, association, or
29	government entity owning, controlling, or operating any business or service which

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1	furnishes, operates, conducts, maintains, advertises, engages in, proposes to engage
2	in, or professes to engage in the business or service of transporting, in air
3	ambulances, individuals who may need medical attention during transport.
4	(3.2) "Auto-injector" means a spring-loaded needle and syringe with a single
5	dose of epinephrine that will automatically release and inject the medicine.
6	(4) "Bureau" means the Department of Health and Hospitals, office of public
7	health, bureau of emergency medical services.
8	(5) "Certified emergency medical technician" means an individual who is
9	certified as any one of the following: "Licensed emergency medical services
10	practitioner'' means an individual who is nationally registered, who has
11	successfully completed an emergency medical services practitioner education
12	program based on national EMS education standards, and who is licensed as
13	any one of the following:
14	(a) A certified licensed emergency medical technician-basic.
15	(b) A certified licensed advanced emergency medical technician-
16	intermediate.

18	(6) "Certified emergency medical technician-basic" means an individual who
19	has successfully completed an emergency medical technician-basic training program
20	developed and promulgated by the United States Department of Transportation and

22	bureau.
23	(7) "Certified emergency medical technician-intermediate" means any
24	individual who has successfully completed an emergency medical technician-
25	intermediate training program developed and promulgated by the United States
26	Department of Transportation and adopted by the bureau, who is nationally
27	registered, and who is certified by the bureau.
28	(8) "Certified emergency medical technician-paramedic" means any
29	individual who has successfully completed an emergency medical technician-

16 (13) (9) "Emergency medical response vehicle" means a marked emergency vehicle with fully visual and audible warning signals operated by a certified 17 ambulance service, the primary purpose of which is to respond to the scene of a 18 19 medical emergency to provide emergency medical stabilization or support, or command, control, and communications, but which is not an ambulance designed or 20 21 intended for the purpose of transporting a victim from the scene to a medical facility regardless of its designation. Included are such vehicles referred to but not limited 22 to the designation as "sprint car", "quick response vehicle", "special response 23 vehicle", "triage trucks", "staff cars", "supervisor units", and other similar 24 designations. Emergency medical response vehicles shall not include fire apparatus 25 and law enforcement patrol vehicles which carry first aid or emergency medical 26 27 supplies and which respond to medical emergencies as part of their routine duties.

(14) (10) "Emergency medical services" or "EMS" means a system that represents the combined efforts of several professionals and agencies to provide

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(14.1) (11) "EMS professional" means an individual who is a certified first
 responder or certified emergency medical technician. "EMS practitioner" means
 an individual who is a licensed emergency medical technician, licensed advanced
 emergency medical technician, or a licensed paramedic.
 (15) (12) "EMS task force" means the Emergency Medical Services Task
 Force, composed of individuals appointed by the assistant secretary of the office of
 public health, subject to the approval of the secretary of the department, which

(16) "First aid certificate" means a certificate in the Emergency Response
 Course issued by the American Red Cross or other certificate in a first aid course
 approved by the bureau and issued to any individual who has successfully completed
 the required training and met the established standards of such organizations.

(17) (13) "Industrial ambulance" means any vehicle owned and operated by
an industrial facility and used for transporting any employee who becomes sick,
injured, or otherwise incapacitated in the course and scope of his employment from
a job site to an appropriate medical facility.

19 (18) (14) "Moral turpitude" means an act of baseness, vileness, or depravity
20 in the duties which one person owes another, or to society in general, which is
21 contrary to the usual, accepted, and customary rule of right and duty which a person
22 should follow.

(19) (15) "Municipal nonprofit organization" means an organization owned
by a parish, municipality, or entity of a parish or municipality which in its regular
course of business responds to a call for help and renders medical treatment and
whose attendants are emergency medical personnel, a registered nurse, or a
physician.

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1	(21) (17) "Volunteer nonprofit organization" means an organization which
2	in its regular course of business responds to a call for help and renders medical

4	or a physician and which is chartered as a nonprofit organization under Section 501c
5	of the United States Internal Revenue Code, as a volunteer fire department by the
6	Louisiana state fire marshal's office, or as a nonprofit organization by the Louisiana
7	secretary of state.
8	(18) "EMS medical director" means a physician licensed by the
9	Louisiana State Board of Medical Examiners who has ultimate responsibility
10	and authority to assure quality of care and provide management, supervision,
11	and guidance for all medical aspects of EMS.
12	(19) "National EMS education standards" means the document that
13	outlines current nationally recognized EMS education standards, has been
14	adopted by the bureau, and defines terminal objective for each nationally
15	defined EMS licensing level.
16	§1231.1. Emergency medical services program; cooperation of other state
17	departments
18	A. The department shall establish and maintain a program for the
19	improvement and regulation of emergency medical services in the state. The
20	responsibility for implementation and conduct of this program shall be vested in the
21	office of public health, bureau of emergency medical services.

23	SUBPART B. EMERGENCY MEDICAL PERSONNEL
24	§1232. Emergency medical personnel training; certification
25	A. The bureau shall promulgate rules and regulations in accordance with the
26	Administrative Procedure Act for the following:
27	(1) To define and authorize appropriate functions and pre-certification and
28	post-certification training programs for emergency medical personnel. All such
29	training programs shall meet or exceed the performance requirements developed by

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1	the United States Department of Transportation. education programs based on
2	national EMS education standards for emergency medical services
3	practitioners. All such education programs shall meet or exceed national EMS
4	education standards.
5	(2) To specify minimum operational requirements which will assure medical
6	direction, supervision, and control over emergency medical services.
7	(3) To specify minimum testing examination and continuing education
8	requirements for all emergency medical personnel services practitioners.
9	(4) To provide for the issuance of certificates and licenses, renewals of
10	certificates licenses, and requirements for emergency medical personnel services
11	<u>practitioners</u> .
12	(5) To specify initial certification and certification renewal requirements
13	consistent with the National Registry of Emergency Medical Technicians for each
14	level of emergency medical personnel.
15	(6) (5) To establish fees for certification and certification license and license
16	renewal.
17	B. An individual petitioning for certification or certification license or
18	license renewal as a certified emergency medical technician or a certified first
19	responder an emergency medical services practitioner shall submit an application
20	to the bureau on forms provided by the bureau. The application shall be accompanied
21	by the appropriate fee.

23	§1232.1. Fee schedule; fees for certification license prohibited
24	A.(1) The bureau shall not require or collect any fee or charges for
25	certification or recertification license or license renewal of emergency medical
26	personnel services practitioners who serve as such on a voluntary basis and who
27	receive no compensation of any kind for such services.
28	(2) The bureau shall not set the fee for certification <u>license</u> of an emergency
29	medical technician-basic to exceed fifteen dollars for any individual who is an

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1 employee or volunteer of the state of Louisiana or another public entity, a municipal 2 fire department, a fire protection district, a volunteer fire department, or a municipal 3 law enforcement agency who does not perform emergency medical services outside of the individual's official governmental responsibilities for any form of 4 compensation. 5 (3) The bureau shall not set the fee for recertification license renewal of an 6 7 emergency medical technician-basic to exceed ten dollars for any individual who is 8 an employee or volunteer of the state of Louisiana or another public entity, a 9 municipal fire department, a fire protection district, a volunteer fire department, or a municipal law enforcement agency who does not perform emergency medical 10 11 services outside of the individual's official governmental responsibilities for any

form of compensation.

6	§1232.2. Louisiana Emergency Medical Services Certification Commission;
7	creation; membership; qualifications; terms; vacancies; meetings;
8	officers; compensation; domicile

10	B.(1) The commission shall be composed of eleven voting members
11	appointed by the governor as follows:
12	* * *
13	(b) Two certified emergency medical technician- licensed paramedics and
14	one licensed emergency medical technician-basic who are certified approved as
15	emergency medical services instructors educators by the bureau. Until November
16	6, 2011, or the member's resignation from the commission, whichever is earlier, at
17	least one of the members as provided in this Subparagraph shall be a full-time
18	employee of a fire department. After November 6, 2011, or the member's resignation
19	from the commission, at least one of the members as provided in this Subparagraph
20	shall be appointed by the Louisiana Fire Chiefs Association.
21	* * *
22	(d) One member who is, at a minimum, a state-certified emergency medical
23	technician-basic nominated by the Louisiana Municipal Association.
24	* * *
25	(2) The commission shall also have one non voting member appointed by the
26	governor who is a registered nurse and who is a state-certified licensed paramedic
27	to be nominated by the Louisiana State Nurses Association from a list of two names
28	submitted by the Louisiana Emergency Nurses Association.

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1 G.(1) Subsequent to the appointment of the initial members, the voting 2 members shall be appointed from a list of two nominees for each appointment submitted by the task force. No later than thirty days prior to the termination date of 3 a member's term, the task force or, for the nonvoting member, the Louisiana State 4 5 Nurses Association, shall submit a list of nominees to the governor. If the Louisiana State Nurses Association or the task force fails to submit the required list of 6 7 nominees to the governor within thirty days, the governor shall appoint the 8 respective member to fill the vacancy without the nomination list required. 9 (2) A vacancy on the commission prior to the expiration of a term shall be

10filled for the remainder of the term. No later than thirty days after the occurrence of11a vacancy prior to the expiration of a term, the task force or, for the nonvoting12member, the Louisiana State Nurses Association, shall submit a list of nominees to13the governor. If the Louisiana State Nurses Association or the task force fails to14submit the required list of nominees to the governor within thirty days, the governor15shall appoint the respective member to fill the vacancy without the nomination list16required.

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§1232.3. Powers and duties of the commission; exceptions

A. The commission shall:

20 (1) Recommend to the bureau requirements and standards of practice scope
 21 of practice for individuals seeking to be certified under this Subpart.

(2) Approve requirements and standards of practice scope of practice
submitted by the bureau for emergency medical personnel services practitioners
consistent with this Subpart.

(3) Recommend continuing education requirements and standards to the
 bureau in accordance with criteria established by the National Registry of
 Emergency Medical Technicians for individuals seeking to renew a certificate
 <u>license</u>.

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1	B. Except as they relate to scope of practice or patient care issues, Paragraphs
2	(A)(4), (5), and (6) of this Section shall not apply to anyone who is a volunteer of or
3	employed by the state of Louisiana or another public entity, a municipal fire
4	department, a fire protection district, or a volunteer fire department who has
5	successfully completed an emergency medical technician-basic, emergency medical
6	technician-intermediate, emergency medical technician-paramedic, or first responder
7	training program developed and promulgated by the United States Department of
8	Transportation education program based on national EMS education standards
9	and who possesses a current national and state certification and state license, until
10	the commission has forwarded the nonmedical practice complaint to the local
11	governing body and received a response with investigative results and any
12	disciplinary disposition. In the event that the local governing body does not send a
13	response or request for extension to the commission within sixty days after receipt
14	of the complaint, the commission may proceed with the powers and duties as defined
15	in Subsection A of this Section. Notwithstanding any law to the contrary, in the event
16	the commission determines by a two-thirds vote of the membership of the
17	commission that public health and safety would be jeopardized by waiting for a
18	response from the local governing authority, the commission shall have the right to
19	exercise its powers and duties as provided in Subsection A of this Section without
20	receipt of an investigative report from the local governing authority or the expiration
21	of the sixty-day period as provided in this Subsection.
22	\$1232.4. Powers and duties of the bureau
23	The bureau shall:
24	(1) Issue a certificate license and renew a certificate license to any duly
25	qualified applicant for certification or for certification license and license renewal
26	as a certified first responder or certified emergency medical technician.

7	§1232.5. Certification License; requirements; renewal
8	A. Applicants for initial certification license as emergency personnel
9	medical services practitioners shall submit the following evidence to the bureau:
10	(1) Completion of the required approved educational program.
11	(2) Documentation that the applicant meets the qualifications and
12	requirements as established by the bureau.
13	B. In lieu of the evidence required by Subsection A of this Section, an
14	applicant may submit evidence that he has been duly licensed or certified in another
15	state, territory, or country or has received military training and certification or
16	license as emergency medical personnel services practitioner as defined in R.S.
17	40:1231, and meets the qualifications and requirements established by the bureau.
18	C.(1) The certificate <u>license</u> shall be renewed every two years provided the
19	applicant seeking renewal completes the application and meets the requirements for
20	renewal established by the bureau prior to the expiration date on his current
21	certificate <u>license</u> .
22	(2) An individual whose certificate <u>license</u> expires by his failure to renew
23	as provided may be reinstated provided the applicant submits a completed
24	application and meets any additional requirements established by the bureau for an
25	individual who has failed to timely renew his certificate license.
26	§1232.6. Grounds for disciplinary proceedings
27	The commission may discipline emergency medical services professionals
28	practitioners by directing the bureau to deny, withhold, revoke, restrict, probate, or
29	suspend a certificate license to practice as a certified emergency medical technician

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1	or certified first responder an emergency medical services practitioner, impose
2	fines and assess costs, or otherwise discipline an emergency medical services
3	practitioner , and the commission may direct the bureau to limit, restrict, or deny a
4	student EMS professional emergency medical services practitioner from entering
5	or continuing the clinical phase of EMS education for the following causes:
6	(1) Conviction of selling or attempting to sell, falsely obtaining, or furnishing
7	to a person a certified emergency medical technician or certified first responder
8	certification licensed emergency medical services practitioner document.
9	(2) Conviction of a crime or offense which reflects the inability of <u>an</u>
10	emergency medical services practitioner to provide emergency medical services
11	with due regard for the health and safety of clients or patients or enters a plea of
12	guilty or nolo contendere to a criminal charge regardless of final disposition of the
13	criminal proceeding, including but not limited to expungement or nonadjudication.
14	* * *
15	(12) Has had a certification or license to practice as an EMS professional
16	emergency medical services practitioner or to practice as another health care
17	provider denied, revoked, suspended, or otherwise restricted.
18	* * *
19	(15) Intentional falsification of any document related to license,
20	emergency medical services education, or related to the care of the patient.
21	§1232.7. Hearings of the commission; appeal of decision
22	* * *
23	D. Notice of the commission's decision to revoke, restrict, suspend, or deny
24	a certificate license shall be sent to the individual under investigation by registered
25	mail, return receipt requested, at his last known address as it appears on the records
26	of the bureau.
27	E. An individual whose certification license has been revoked, restricted,
28	suspended, placed in probation, or denied may have the proceedings of the
29	commission reviewed by a court of competent jurisdiction, provided that an appeal

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1	is made no later than thirty days after the date indicated on the registered mail receipt
2	of the notice required by Subsection D of this Section. The decision of the
3	commission shall remain in force until an appeal is granted unless the court orders
4	a stay. If an appeal is granted, the decision of the commission shall be suspended
5	until a final disposition of the matter is ultimately rendered by the court affirming the
6	decision of the commission.

8	§1232.9. Violations
9	No person or individual shall engage in any of the following activities:
10	(1) Sell, or attempt to sell, falsely obtain, or furnish to any person any
11	emergency medical personnel services practitioner diploma, certification license
12	document, or record, or aid or abet therein.
13	(2) Practice as a certified an emergency medical technician or certified first
14	responder services practitioner under any diploma or certificate illegally obtained
15	or signed or issued unlawfully.
16	(3) Practice as a certified an emergency medical technician or certified first
17	responder services practitioner unless certified license to do so under the provisions
18	of this Subpart.
19	(4) Use in connection with his name any designation tending to imply that
20	he is a certified an emergency medical technician or certified first responder services
21	practitioner unless duly authorized to practice under the provisions of this Subpart.
22	(5) Practice as a certified an emergency medical technician or certified first
23	responder services practitioner during the time the certification license issued under

<u>Proposed law</u> implements suggestions developed from the emergency medical services professional working group created by SCR 40 of the 2011 Regular Session.

<u>Proposed law</u> makes changes within the <u>present law</u> to address the federally required changes governing emergency medical services.

<u>Present law</u> provides for the duties of emergency personnel. <u>Proposed law</u> clarifies these duties with respect to the administration of drugs or procedures by the licenced emergency medical services practitioner. Further, <u>proposed law</u> provides for qualifying emergency medical services practitioner students to perform specific functions.

<u>Present law</u> provides for the duties of emergency medical services practitioners when a lifethreatening situation is present and communication with a physician is not possible, and <u>present law</u> provides for service by emergency medical services practitioners for specific medical conditions.

<u>Proposed law</u> provides when a life-threatening situation is present and communication with a physician is not possible, the emergency medical services practitioners may render service in accordance with an established protocol, and the <u>proposed law</u> removes the specific list of medical conditions.
