2	To amend and reenact R.S. 40:1007(G), relative to prescription monitoring information; to
3	provide for access to prescription monitoring information to certain queries from
4	other states, territories, federal districts, and federal jurisdictions; to provide for
5	limited use; and to provide for related matters.
6	Be it enacted by the Legislature of Louisiana:
7	Section 1. R.S. 40:1007(G) is hereby amended and reenacted to read as follows:
8	§1007. Access to prescription monitoring information and audit trail information
9	* * *
10	G. The board may provide prescription monitoring information in response
11	to queries from prescription monitoring programs, electronic health information
12	systems, and pharmacy information systems located in other states, territories
13	federal districts, and federal jurisdictions, through its participation in a secure
14	interstate data exchange system., and the The prescription monitoring information
15	made available pursuant to this Subsection may be used by those programs only
16	in a manner consistent with this Section.

SB 53 Original

<u>Present law</u> authorizes the Board of Pharmacy to provide prescription monitoring information to prescription monitoring programs in other states. <u>Proposed law</u> retains <u>present law</u> and provides further authority for the board to provide prescription monitoring information to electronic health information systems and pharmacy information systems located in other states, territories, federal districts, and federal jurisdictions.

<u>Proposed law</u> makes technical corrections and clarifies that prescription monitoring information provided pursuant to <u>present law</u> may only be used in a manner consistent with present law.

Effective August 1, 2019.
