LOCAL EMPLOYEES. Provides relative to the wages for firefighters. (8/1/14)

AN ACT

2 To amend and reenact R.S. 33:1992(A)(1) and 2002(A)(3)(a), relative to minimum wages for firefighters; to provide relative to the components of a firefighter's starting salary; 3 to provide relative to compliance with the requirements of the Fair Labor Standards 4 5 Act; and to provide for related matters. 6 Be it enacted by the Legislature of Louisiana: 7 Section 1. R.S. 33:1992(A)(1) and 2002(A)(3)(a) are hereby amended and reenacted 8 to read as follows: 9 §1992. Minimum salaries 10 A. The minimum monthly salaries of firemen in municipalities having a 11 population of twelve thousand or more and in the city of Bastrop and of all parish and fire protection district paid firemen, including salaries payable out of the avails 12 13 of any special tax provided by the Constitution of Louisiana for increasing the pay of firemen, shall be in accordance with the following schedule, and such salaries 14 shall be paid semi-monthly not later than the fifth and twentieth day of each calendar 15 16 month:

(1) A fireman shall receive a minimum monthly salary of four hundred

1 dollars per month based on a regular hourly rate of pay compliant with the Fair Labor Standards Act, 29 U.S.C. 201 et seq. This salary shall be exclusive of 2 3 supplemental pay received pursuant to R.S. 33:2002. 4 5 §2002. Extra compensation A. 6 (3)(a) A municipality, parish, fire protection district, or other political 7 8 subdivision maintaining a fire department, or the Chitimacha Tribe of Louisiana or 9 the Coushatta Indian Tribe of Louisiana, or any nonprofit corporation contracting 10 with any such political subdivision to provide fire protection services may enhance the first-year salary of every paid, regularly employed employee in the amount 11 equivalent to the state supplemental pay, or any portion thereof, that the employee 12 13 shall be entitled to be paid after one year of service pursuant to this Subpart, so long as the first-year salary, exclusive of the enhancement, meets the minimum wage 14 obligations of the Fair Labor Standards Act, 29 U.S.C. 201 et seq. 15 16

DIGEST

Gallot (SB 549)

<u>Present law</u>, relative to the wages of firemen, requires that the minimum monthly salaries of firemen in municipalities having a population of 12,000 or more and in the city of Bastrop and of all parish and fire protection district paid firemen, including salaries payable out of the avails of any special tax provided by the constitution for increasing the pay of firemen, is \$400 per month and paid semi-monthly not later than the fifth and twentieth day of each calendar month.

<u>Proposed law</u> requires the minimum monthly salary be based on a regular hourly rate of pay compliant with the Fair Labor Standards Act, 29 U.S.C. 201 et seq., exclusive of supplemental pay received pursuant to R.S. 33:2002.

<u>Present law</u> provides that a municipality, parish, fire protection district, or other political subdivision maintaining a fire department, or the Chitimacha Tribe of Louisiana or the Coushatta Indian Tribe of Louisiana, or any nonprofit corporation contracting with any such political subdivision to provide fire protection services may enhance the first-year salary of every paid, regularly employed employee in the amount equivalent to the state supplemental pay, or any portion thereof, that the employee shall be entitled to be paid after one year of service.

<u>Proposed law retains present law</u> and provides condition that the first-year salary, exclusive of the enhancement, meets the minimum wage obligations of the Fair Labor Standards Act, 29 U.S.C. 201 et seq.

Effective August 1, 2014.

(Amends R.S. 33:1992(A)(1) and 2002(A)(3)(a))
