1	AN ACT
2	To enact R.S. 40:4.13, relative to the Sanitary Code; to provide exceptions to the Sanitary
3	Code; to allow a not-for-profit entity or charitable organization to receive or use
4	certain meats or fish for food or meal distribution at no cost to an individual; and to
5	provide for related matters.
6	Be it enacted by the Legislature of Louisiana:
7	Section 1. R.S. 40:4.13 is hereby enacted to read as follows:
8	§4.13. Not-for-profit entity or charitable organization; receive or use certain
9	meats or fish in food or meal distribution
10	Notwithstanding any provisions of the state Sanitary Code or any other
11	law or regulation to the contrary, it shall be lawful for a not-for-profit entity or
12	a charitable organization to receive or use any commercial or game fish,
13	migratory or resident game bird, game quadruped, as defined in R.S. 56:8,
14	alligator, or feral hog in food or meal distribution at no cost to an individual.

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ENROLLED

1	Section 2. This Act shall become effective upon signature by the governor or, if not
2	signed by the governor, upon expiration of the time for bills to become law without signature
3	by the governor, as provided by Article III, Section 18 of the Constitution of Louisiana. If
4	vetoed by the governor and subsequently approved by the legislature, this Act shall become
5	effective on the day following such approval.
