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AN ACT

SENATE BILL NO. 627

2	To enact R.S. 33:9097.13, relative to neighborhood improvement districts; to create the Live
3	Oak Trace Subdivision Crime Prevention and Improvement District in the city of
4	Zachary in East Baton Rouge Parish; to provide for the boundaries and purpose of
5	the district; to provide for the powers and duties of the district and its board of
6	commissioners; to provide for the levy of a parcel fee upon voter approval; to
7	provide for the district's budget; to provide with respect to termination of the district;
8	and to provide for related matters.
9	Notice of intention to introduce this Act has been published.
10	Be it enacted by the Legislature of Louisiana:
11	Section 1. R.S. 33:9097.13 is hereby enacted to read as follows:
12	§9097.13. Live Oak Trace Subdivision Crime Prevention and Improvement
13	<u>District</u>
14	A. Creation. There is hereby created within the parish of East Baton
15	Rouge, in the city of Zachary, as more specifically provided in Subsection B of
16	this Section, a body politic and corporate which shall be known as the Live Oak
17	Trace Subdivision Crime Prevention and Improvement District, hereafter in
18	this Section referred to as the "district". The district shall be a political
19	subdivision of the state as defined in the Constitution of Louisiana.
20	B. Boundaries. The district shall encompass the area included within the
21	following perimeter: Creek Hollow Avenue, Pine Thickett Avenue, Honeysuckle
22	Drive and Brush Creek Court. The district shall include all parcels on both
23	sides of each street.
24	C. Purpose. The purposes of the district shall be to aid in crime

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1	prevention by providing security for district residents and to serve the needs of
2	the residents of the district by funding beautification and improvements for the
3	overall betterment of the district.
4	D. Board. (1) The district shall be governed by a board of commissioners
5	consisting of seven members as follows:
6	(a) The president of the Live Oak Trace Homeowners' Association, or its
7	successor.
8	(b) Two members appointed by the board of directors of the Live Oak
9	Trace Homeowners' Association, or its successor.
10	(c) One member appointed by the member or members of the Louisiana
11	House of Representatives who represent the area which comprises the district.
12	(d) One member appointed by the member or members of the Louisiana
13	Senate who represent the area which comprises the district.
14	(e) One member appointed by the member or members of the East Baton
15	Rouge Parish Metro Council who represent the area which comprises the
16	district.
17	(f) One member appointed by the mayor-president of Baton Rouge.
18	(2) All members of the board shall be registered voters within the
19	district.
20	(3) All members of the board shall serve without compensation and shall
21	not receive reimbursement for expenses.
22	(4) The domicile of the board shall be within the district.
23	(5) The board shall be authorized to adopt bylaws for its governance and
24	conduct.
25	(6) The members of the board shall select from among themselves a
26	president and such other officers as they deem appropriate, whose
27	responsibilities shall be as provided by the bylaws of the board.
28	(7) The board shall hold regular meetings as provided for in its bylaws
29	and may hold special meetings at such times and places within the district as
30	provided in the bylaws.

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1	(8) The board shall keep minutes of all meetings.
2	(9) A majority of the board shall constitute a quorum for conducting
3	business of the board.
4	E. Terms. (1)(a) Members appointed pursuant to Subparagraphs
5	(D)(1)(a) and (b) of this Section shall serve four-year terms.
6	(b) Members appointed pursuant to Subparagraphs (D)(1)(c), (d), (e),
7	and (f) of this Section shall serve three-year terms.
8	(2) Any board member may be removed for cause by a majority vote of
9	the board.
10	(3) Vacancies shall be filled in the manner of the original appointment.
11	A member shall be eligible for reappointment unless he was removed pursuant
12	to Paragraph (2) of this Subsection.
13	F. Powers and duties. The district, acting through its board of
14	commissioners, shall have the following powers and duties:
15	(1) To sue and be sued.
16	(2) To adopt, use, and alter at will a corporate seal.
17	(3) To receive and expend funds collected pursuant to Subsection G of
18	this Section and in accordance with a budget adopted as provided by Subsection
19	H of this Section.
20	(4) To enter into contracts with individuals or entities, private or public.
21	(5) To purchase items and supplies necessary for achieving any purpose
22	of the district.
23	(6) To accept private grants and donations.
24	(7) To procure and maintain liability insurance against any personal or
25	legal liability of a board member that may be asserted or incurred based upon
26	his service as a member of the board or that may arise as a result of his actions
27	taken within the scope and discharge of his duties as a member of the board.
28	(8) To perform or have performed any function or activity the board
29	deems necessary to carry out the purposes of the district.
30	G. Parcel fee. The governing authority of East Baton Rouge Parish is

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1	nereby authorized to impose and conect a parcei fee within the district subject
2	to and in accordance with the provisions of this Subsection.
3	(1) The fee shall be as determined by a duly adopted resolution of the
4	board, at an amount no less than one hundred eighty dollars, per parcel per
5	year.
6	(2) The fee shall be imposed on each parcel located within the district.
7	The term "parcel" as used in this Subsection shall mean a developed or
8	undeveloped lot.
9	(3) The owner of the parcel shall be responsible for payment of the fee.
10	(4)(a) The fee shall be imposed only after the question of its imposition
11	has been submitted to the qualified electors of the district, at an election held for
12	such purpose in accordance with the Louisiana Election Code, and a majority
13	of those voting on the proposition have voted in favor of the fee.
14	(b) The fee may be increased four years from its initial levy in the same
15	manner as its imposition.
16	(5) The East Baton Rouge Parish Sheriff's Office shall collect the fee at
17	the same time and in the same manner as ad valorem taxes are collected.
18	(6) The East Baton Rouge Parish Sheriff's Office shall remit to the
19	district all amounts collected not more than sixty days after collection; however,
20	the board may enter into an agreement with the East Baton Rouge Parish
21	Sheriff's Office to authorize the parish to retain, as a collection fee, not more
22	than one percent of the amount collected.
23	(7) Any parcel fee which is unpaid shall be added to the tax rolls of the
24	parish and shall be enforced with the same authority and subject to the same
25	penalties and procedures as unpaid ad valorem taxes.
26	H. Budget. (1) The board of commissioners shall adopt an annual budget
27	in accordance with the Louisiana Local Government Budget Act, R.S. 39:1301
28	<u>et seq.</u>
29	(2) The district shall be subject to audit by the legislative auditor
30	<u>pursuant to R.S. 24:513.</u>

**SB NO. 627 ENROLLED** 1 I. Miscellaneous provisions. (1) It is the purpose and intent of this Section 2 that the additional law enforcement personnel and services provided by the district shall be supplemental to and not in lieu of personnel and services 3 4 provided in the district by the city of Zachary. 5 (2) If the district ceases to exist: (a) All funds of the district shall be transmitted by the board to the 6 governing authority of the city of Zachary within thirty days of dissolution. 7 Such transmitted funds, together with any other funds collected by the East 8 9 Baton Rouge Parish Sheriff's Office pursuant to this Section, shall be 10 maintained in a separate account by the city and shall be used only to promote, 11 encourage, and enhance the security, beautification, and overall betterment of 12 the area formerly comprising the district. (b) The authority for the imposition of the parcel fee provided in this 13 14 Section shall cease. 15 Section 2. This Act shall become effective upon signature by the governor or, if not 16 signed by the governor, upon expiration of the time for bills to become law without signature by the governor, as provided by Article III, Section 18 of the Constitution of Louisiana. If 17 18 vetoed by the governor and subsequently approved by the legislature, this Act shall become 19 effective on the day following such approval.
