6	Section 1. R.S. 47:342(3) is hereby amended and reenacted to read as follows:
7	§342. General definitions
8	For the purposes of this Chapter, unless the context clearly otherwise requires
9	or unless otherwise defined in specific portions of the Chapter, the following words
10	shall have the respective meanings ascribed to each in this Section.

12	(3)(a) Contractor. "Contractor" is synonymous with the term "Builder" and
13	means a person, firm, partnership, corporation, association, or other organization, or
14	a combination of them, which undertakes to or offers to undertake to, or purports to
15	have the capacity to undertake to, or submits a bid to, or does himself or by or
16	through others, construct, alter, repair, add to, subtract from, improve, move, wreck,
17	or demolish any building, highway, road, railroad, excavation, or other structure,
18	project, development or improvement, or to do any part thereof, including the
19	erection of scaffolding or other structure or works in connection therewith and
20	includes subcontractors and specialty contractors. As such, the word, "contractor"
21	shall include oil field service contractors, which shall consist of including those
22	contractors performing general oil well servicing, maintenance, and construction
23	when conducted as a single company unit. "General oil well servicing" shall include
24	welding, pipe coating, pipe inspection, wireline service, automation, workover,
25	logging, analysis, seismograph, installing and servicing equipment, packing,
26	platform work, perforating, and completion.

19	servicing equipment, packing, platform work, perforating, and completion.

21	Section 2. The provisions of R.S. 47:342(3)(b) as enacted by this Act shall cease to
22	be effective on July 1, 2011.
