AN ACT

2 To amend and reenact R.S. 43:202(A), relative to judicial and legal advertisements in Orleans Parish; to authorize judicial advertisements in specified weekly news 3 publications; to provide for public bid; to provide for requirements for the weekly 4 5 news publication; and to provide for related matters. Notice of intention to introduce this Act has been published. 7 Be it enacted by the Legislature of Louisiana: 8 Section 1. R.S. 43:202(A) is hereby amended and reenacted to read as follows: 9 §202. Judicial advertisements in parish of Orleans 10 A.(1) In the parish of Orleans, when advertisements are required to be made 11 in relation to judicial proceedings, or in the sale of property under judicial process, or in any other legal proceedings of whatever kind, the advertisement shall be 12 13 inserted in a daily newspaper or weekly news publication published in an office physically located in the parish of Orleans and published in the English language, 14 and which has been published as a daily paper or weekly news publication for at 15 least five years prior to the insertion of the advertisement or publication. The 16 newspaper or weekly news publication shall be selected by the sheriff, constable, 17

1 clerk, or other officer, as the case may be, who is charged with the conduct of the 2 sale. The responsible official selecting the newspaper or weekly news publication to publish judicial advertisements and legal notices shall make his selection in June 3 of each year for a term of one year. The If a daily newspaper is selected, it shall 4 5 meet the requirements of a newspaper as defined in R.S. 43:200(3) and shall have been entered in a U.S. post office United States Post Office in Orleans Parish under 6 7 a periodical permit for a period of five years preceding its selection to publish legal 8 advertisements and legal notices. <u>If a weekly news publication is selected under</u> 9 this Subsection, it shall meet the requirements of a news publication as defined 10 in R.S. 43:301(24) and it shall have maintained a total circulation of at least twenty-five thousand in the parishes of Orleans and all immediately adjacent 11 12 parishes for at least eight consecutive years immediately prior to being selected. 13 The total circulation of the weekly news publication shall be proved not less than annually by a nationally recognized news publication auditing firm prior 14 to the selection of the news publication as provided for in this Section. The 15 audits shall reflect the circulation of the news publication by parish, and the 16 most recent audit shall be submitted as an attachment to any proposal by a 17 news publication to publish judicial advertisements and legal notices in the 18 19 parish of Orleans. 20 (2) There shall be an annual public bid to select the newspaper or 21

publication for advertisements required to be made pursuant to Paragraph (1) of this Subsection.

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Section 2. This Act shall become effective upon signature by the governor or, if not signed by the governor, upon expiration of the time for bills to become law without signature by the governor, as provided by Article III, Section 18 of the Constitution of Louisiana. If vetoed by the governor and subsequently approved by the legislature, this Act shall become effective on the day following such approval.

## **DIGEST**

Murray (SB 751)

<u>Present law</u> provides that in Orleans Parish, advertisements required to be made in relation to judicial proceedings, or in the sale of property under judicial process, or in any other legal proceedings of whatever kind, the advertisement shall be inserted in a daily newspaper published in an office physically located in the parish of Orleans, published in the English language, and which has been published as a daily paper for at least five years prior to the insertion of the advertisement or publication.

<u>Proposed law</u> retains <u>present law</u> but also authorizes the advertisement to be in a weekly news publication.

<u>Present law</u> requires the newspaper to meet requirements of a defined newspaper and to have a periodical permit from the U.S. Post Office in Orleans Parish for a period of five years preceding its selection to publish legal advertisements and legal notices.

<u>Proposed law</u> requires a weekly news publication to have maintained a total circulation of at least 25,000 in the parishes of Orleans and all immediately adjacent parishes for at least eight consecutive years immediately prior to being selected and requires the total circulation of the weekly news publication be proved not less than annually by a nationally recognized news publication auditing firm prior to the selection of the publication.

<u>Proposed law</u> requires the audit to reflect the circulation of the news publication by parish and the most recent audit shall be submitted as an attachment to any proposal by a news publication to publish judicial advertisements and legal notices in Orleans Parish.

<u>Proposed law</u> requires there be an annual public bid to select the newspaper or publication for certain judicial advertisements.

Effective upon signature of the governor or lapse of time for gubernatorial action.
