6	Section 1. R.S. 22:1962(C) is hereby amended and reenacted to read as follows:

10	C. "Insurer" means any person, reciprocal exchange, interinsurer, Lloyds
11	insurer, fraternal benefit society, industrial and burial insurer, or any insurer that
12	markets under the Home Service Marketing distribution method and issues a
13	majority of its policies on a weekly or monthly basis, or any other legal entity
14	engaged in the business of insurance, including insurance producers. "Insurer" shall
15	also mean medical service plans, hospital service plans, health maintenance
16	organizations, and prepaid limited health care service plans. "Insurer" shall also
17	mean any person or legal entity issued a certificate of self-insurance pursuant

1	to R.S. 32:1042. For the purposes of this Part, these foregoing entities shall be
2	deemed to be engaged in the business of insurance.

7	E. Any person or any legal entity issued a certificate of self-insurance

<u>Present law</u>, relative to traffic and motor vehicles allows any person in whose name more than 25 motor vehicles are registered or who owns property in Louisiana assessed in his name having a value of \$100,000 or more to qualify as a self-insurer by obtaining a certificate of self-insurance issued by the assistant secretary of the office of motor vehicles.

<u>Present law</u> prohibits insurers from engaging in methods, practices, and acts declared to be unfair or deceptive under <u>present law</u>.

<u>Proposed law</u> retains <u>present law</u> and provides that the prohibitions on unfair or deceptive trade practices applies to anyone with a certificate of self-insurance.

Effective August 1, 2020.
