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| 2 | To amend and reenact R.S. $17:5024(A)(1)(a)$, and to enact R.S. $17:5024.1$, and to repeal R.S. |

| 4 | Program for Students; to provide relative to eligibility requirements for program |
| 5 | awards; to provide for recodification of certain provisions of present law; and to |

| 7 | Be it enacted by the Legislature of Louisiana: |
| 8 | Section 1. R.S. 17:5024(A)(1)(a) is hereby amended and reenacted and R.S. |
| 9 | 17:5024.1 is hereby enacted to read as follows: |
| 10 | §5024. Academic requirements |
| 11 | A.(1) Except as otherwise provided by this Subsection, students Students |
| 12 | shall meet the following minimum grade point average requirements, calculated on |
| 13 | a 4.00 scale using only the grades obtained by the student in completing the core |
| 14 | curriculum requirements established by this Chapter, for the respective awards: |
| 15 | (a) For an Opportunity Award, a minimum cumulative grade point average |
| 16 | of 2.50 <u>2.75</u> . |

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| 2 | A. Notwithstanding R.S. 17:5024(A): |
| 3 | (1) A student graduating from high school prior to the 2019-2020 school |
| 4 | year shall have a minimum grade point average of 2.50, calculated on a 4.00 |
| 5 | scale using only the grades obtained by the student in completing the core |
| 6 | curriculum requirements established by this Chapter, to be eligible to receive |
| 7 | an Opportunity Award. |
| 8 | (2) For a student who graduated prior to the 2002-2003 school year, the |

| 10 | signed by the governor, upon expiration of the time for bills to become law without signature |
| 11 | by the governor, as provided by Article III, Section 18 of the Constitution of Louisiana. If |
| 12 | vetoed by the governor and subsequently approved by the legislature, this Act shall become |
| 13 | effective on the day following such approval. |

<u>Present law</u> provides relative to the Taylor Opportunity Program for Students (TOPS) as a program of merit scholarships for students attending certain postsecondary education institutions and who meet specific grade point average (GPA), ACT score, and core curriculum requirements and certain other qualifications.

<u>Proposed law</u> increases the GPA requirement for initial eligibility for an Opportunity Award for students graduating from high school during or after the 2019-2020 school year from 2.50 to 2.75.

<u>Present law</u> provides for exceptions to the eligibility requirements for students graduating from high school in prior years. <u>Proposed law</u> retains these exceptions, but recodifies them in a new provision of law.

Effective upon signature of the governor or lapse of time for gubernatorial action.
