Saturday, September 5, 2009; and

WHEREAS, Tony, a native of Baton Rouge, was born on June 6, 1922, to Samuel

WHEREAS, he attended Catholic High School and graduated in 1940; and

WHEREAS, Mr. Salvaggio attended Louisiana State University, then served in the
United States Marine Corps during World War II and received an honorable discharge in
1945; and

Polytechnic Institute where he also lettered in football; and

WHEREAS, during their marriage, Tony and his wife, Emma Christine "Chris"
McLaurin Salvaggio, were blessed with five children: Anthony G. Salvaggio, Jr., Carolyn
Salvaggio Torrance, Paul Salvaggio, Lisa Salvaggio Gilbert, and Laurie Salvaggio Baker;

WHEREAS, Tony and Chris, founded Salco Construction, Inc., in 1969; and

WHEREAS, Tony was a member of St. Patrick Catholic Church, the Knights of
Columbus, the Red Stick Kiwanis Club, and the Choctaw Detachment of the Marine Corps
League; and

WHEREAS, Mr. Salvaggio, who was admired by all whose lives he touched, leaves
behind a rich and unique legacy and is greatly missed; and
