A CONCURRENT RESOLUTION 1 2 To recognize Wednesday, April 24, 2019, as the thirty-fifth annual Red and White Day at 3 the Louisiana Legislature. 4 WHEREAS, the celebration of Red and White Day at the Louisiana Legislature 5 began in 1985 and has grown from a Louisiana tradition to one observed by more than one thousand sorority and fraternity chapters throughout the country; a celebration is held 6 7 annually at the nation's capital in Washington, D.C.; and 8 WHEREAS, Red and White Day is an activity of Delta Sigma Theta Sorority, 9 Incorporated, which was founded on January 13, 1913, by twenty-two collegiate women at Howard University who were eager to use their collective strength to promote academic 10 11 excellence, to provide scholarship funding, to support those in need, to stimulate participation in the establishment of positive public policy, to highlight issues affecting 12 13 minorities and women, and to find viable solutions to social problems; and 14 WHEREAS, Delta Sigma Theta Sorority was incorporated in 1930 as a private, nonprofit organization; and 15 16 WHEREAS, Delta Sigma Theta Sorority, Incorporated, is the largest African American Greek letter sorority with more than nine hundred chapters in the United 17 States, England, Japan, Germany, the Virgin Islands, Bermuda, Haiti, the Bahamas, and the 18
