WHEREAS, Officer LaValley then attended the Shreveport Police Academy graduating at the top of his class and served as an officer for four years; and

WHEREAS, he enjoyed hunting and fishing and was an avid New Orleans Saints fan, naming his cat "Drew"; and

WHEREAS, Officer LaValley is survived by his mother, Jacqueline Ann LeBeau; father, Joseph Thomas LaValley; brother, Alexander Paul LaValley; sisters, Kimberly Bessa and her husband, Tyler, and Andrea Anderson and her husband, Kevin; maternal grandmother, Helen B. LeBeau; niece, Emily Bessa; nephews, Tyler, Caleb, and Joshua Bessa; and WHEREAS, he was preceded in death by his maternal grandfather, Eddie Paul LeBeau, and paternal grandparents, Lillian and Thomas Joseph LaValley; and

WHEREAS, Thomas LaValley is a hero who demonstrated bravery, courage, and devotion and will never be forgotten for his service and lighthearted, noncomplaining disposition; and

WHEREAS, the success of the state of Louisiana, our cities, and American society depend in great measure on men like Officer Thomas LaValley.
