AMUSEMENTS/SPORTS. Encourages the NFL team owners and the NFL Players' Association to resolve labor differences to ensure an uninterrupted 2010 football season.

1	A CONCURRENT RESOLUTION
2	To encourage the owners and players of the National Football League to resolve their
3	differences in order to avoid interrupting, shortening, or eliminating the 2010 season.
4	WHEREAS, the New Orleans Saints' team and organization had an outstanding 2009
5	season and Super Bowl Championship that produced many exciting, magical moments for
6	the people of the city of New Orleans, the State of Louisiana, the Gulf Coast Region, and the
7	United States; and
8	WHEREAS, Super Bowl XLIV was watched by over one hundred million viewers,
9	becoming the most-watched program in U.S. television history; and
10	WHEREAS, the National Football League is a highly successful sports organization
11	with steadily increasing revenues and television ratings; and
12	WHEREAS, the popularity of professional football has provided a tremendously
13	positive economic impact across our state and country; and
14	WHEREAS, the taxpayers of Louisiana have invested millions of dollars in the
15	success of the National Football League and specifically the Saints; organization by
16	supporting stadium improvements, practice facilities, and other incentives; and
17	WHEREAS, the current National Football League owners and players are operating
18	without a labor agreement that may result in work stoppage in the 2011 season; and

WHEREAS, a work stoppage in the National Football League would have a detrimental impact on countless Louisiana businesses, including restaurants, bars, transportation companies, hotels, and other travel related businesses and therefore would reduce tax revenue and jobs for our state; and
