

SENATE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION NO. 8

A CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

To urge and request the state Department of Education to investigate the feasibility and cost of installing silent alarms in all elementary and secondary school classrooms in Louisiana.

WHEREAS, school gun violence is becoming a common occurrence throughout the United States; and

WHEREAS, violence takes place in the first few minutes an intruder is on site and speed of response to an emergency is critical; and

WHEREAS, relying solely on personal notification for emergencies can limit a school's ability to reach law enforcement; and

WHEREAS, a silent alarm greatly reduces the time gap between someone recognizing a threat and receiving help and would allow school personnel to push a button, thereby alerting authorities of an emergency situation and aiding law enforcement to respond more quickly; and

WHEREAS, silent alarms are commonplace technology in financial institutions and have been installed in schools across the United States to better protect students and teachers; and

WHEREAS, student and teacher safety should be a top priority in Louisiana and adding an additional layer of safety could be the protection needed to save their lives.

THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Legislature of Louisiana does hereby urge and request the state Department of Education to investigate the feasibility and cost of installing silent alarms in all elementary and secondary school classrooms in Louisiana.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the department shall submit a written report of its findings and recommendations to the Senate Committee on Education and the House Committee on Education not later than February 1, 2019.
