A RESOLUTION

To express the support of the Louisiana Senate for, and to urge and request continued participation in, the America's Legislators Back to School Program sponsored by the National Conference of State Legislatures (NCSL).

WHEREAS, each year, Louisiana Senators have been strong supporters of the Legislators Back to School Program; and, according to statistics compiled by NCSL, the Louisiana Senate had eighty-two percent of its senators who participated in the program during the 2010-2011 school year, which ranked the Louisiana Senate as the second highest Senate chamber in the nation; and

WHEREAS, by sharing their experiences, legislators bring civics to life by helping to dispel young people's cynicism, distrust, and misunderstanding about government and by encouraging them to play an active role in their communities.

THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Senate of the Legislature of Louisiana expresses its support for, and urges continued participation in, the America's Legislators Back to School Program sponsored by the National Conference of State Legislatures.
