A RESOLUTION

To commend the city of Abbeville, Louisiana, on winning its district title in the Louisiana Garden Club Federation's Cleanest City contest.

WHEREAS, Mayor Piazza reported that several government buildings were on the route that the judges took around the city, including the Vermilion Parish Court House, the Vermilion Parish Sheriff's office, the Vermilion Parish governmental complex and the library, all of which reflected the diligent work that government employees and volunteers contributed to having the city look its best; and
