11	Development and Environmental Policy in Poland and the Czech Republic (1999), Power
12	and Responsibility: Building International Order in an Era of Transnational Threats (2010),
13	Louisiana's Alternative Energy Policy: How the Bayou State could become the Biomass
14	State (2009), and published many other articles too numerous to mention; and
