COMMENDATIONS. Commends Senator Jean-Paul "JP" Morrell for his distinguished service in the Louisiana Legislature, particularly in the Senate representing Senate District No. 3.

2	To commend the Honorable Jean-Paul "JP" Morrell on his exemplary service in the
3	Louisiana Legislature and to express enduring gratitude for his outstanding
4	contributions made on behalf of his constituents and the state of Louisiana,
5	particularly his tenure as a distinguished member of the Louisiana Senate
6	representing District No. 3 and the Louisiana House of Representative representing
7	District No. 97.
8	WHEREAS, Senator Jean-Paul "JP" Morrell was born and raised in the 7th Ward of
9	New Orleans, Louisiana, the third of four boys born to Arthur and Cynthia Morrell, an
10	attorney and public school principal respectively; and
11	WHEREAS, during his formative years, his parents impressed upon him the
12	importance of education, advocacy, and public service through the various appointed and
13	elected positions in which they served, with Arthur Morrell representing District No. 97 in
14	the House of Representatives; and
15	WHEREAS, JP and his wife Catherine have three children: Jude, Fiona, and
16	Alexander; and
17	WHEREAS, he received his Bachelor of Political Science from Spring Hill College
18	in Mobile, Alabama, and his Juris Doctor from Tulane University Law School in

1 New Orleans; and

WHEREAS, Senator Morrell, as an attorney, specializes in insurance, healthcare, and
 regulatory and compliance law as well as environmental, land use, and zoning advocacy; and
 WHEREAS, he served as a member of the Orleans Parish Office of Indigent Public
 Defender Program for Magistrate Court, providing legal services for clients who could not
 afford an attorney for misdemeanor offenses; and

WHEREAS, JP, as a public servant elected into the Louisiana House of
Representatives in 2006 to fill the unexpired term of his father and during the aftermath of
Hurricane Katrina, was heavily involved in recovery efforts, neighborhood participation, and
voter advocacy in the wake of that devastating disaster; and

WHEREAS, upon reelection in 2007, JP was selected to chair the House Municipal,
Parochial and Cultural Affairs Committee, becoming one of the youngest chairmen in the
history of the Louisiana House of Representatives and, while a member of the House, he also
served on the Committee on Appropriations, Committee on Civil Law and Procedure, and
House Committee on Education; and

WHEREAS, upon being elected to the Louisiana State Senate in 2008 in a special election for District No. 3, he was immediately named to the chairmanship of the Senate Local and Municipal Affairs Committee; after his re-election in 2011, JP served as the chairman of the Senate Judiciary B Committee; and after being reelected in 2015, he is currently serving as the chairman of the Senate Revenue and Fiscal Affairs Committee, which sets tax policies for the state of Louisiana; and

WHEREAS, the senator has also served on the Senate Committee on Insurance, Senate Committee on Environmental Quality, Senate Committee on Retirement, Senate Committee on Education, Senate Committee on Natural Resources, Senate Committee on Senate and Governmental Affairs, Senate Committee on Labor and Industrial Relations, Senate Select Committee on Oversight of the Deepwater Horizon Claims, Senate Select Committee on Disaster Recovery, Joint Legislative Committee on the Budget, Joint Legislative Committee on Capital Outlay, and State Bond Commission; and

WHEREAS, because JP is a proven capable leader who builds bipartisan coalitions
to pass complex and controversial legislation, he has been very instrumental in successfully

passing key legislative issues such as: comprehensive sentencing and criminal justice
reform; extensive juvenile justice reform such as changing the age for adult prosecution from
seventeen to eighteen years of age, thus bringing Louisiana into conformity with the rest of
the United States; increasing educational opportunities for incarcerated adults; and more
expansive probation and parole eligibility; and

6 WHEREAS, he has helped to pass sweeping legislation regarding a plethora of 7 women's issues, such as increased transparency of rape kit testing, comprehensive changes 8 regarding sexual assault on college campuses, increased protection for victims of domestic 9 violence, as well as expanding the remedies of domestic assault victims to obtain immediate 10 divorces and sue their abusers for support; and

WHEREAS, JP is considered a champion regarding reproductive rights and has
authored bills regarding equal pay for women; and

WHEREAS, he has authored extensive ethics and governmental reform legislation
which was enacted; such as substantially restructuring the Orleans Parish Sewerage and
Water Board for the first time in over 100 years, as well as banning companies involved in
bribery schemes from continuing to contract with municipal, parish, or state entities; and

WHEREAS, he is active in many caucuses, continually sharing his valuable
knowledge with colleagues, media, students, and anyone interested in building a better
Louisiana; and

20 WHEREAS, Senator Jean-Paul "JP" Morrell deserves a special measure of
21 commendation for his service to his district and the state of Louisiana.
