SENATE RESOLUTION NO. 215

## BY SENATOR BARROW

LEGIS POWERS/FUNCTIONS. Creates the Task Force on Sensible Gun Control.

1	A RESOLUTION
2	To create and provide for the Task Force on Sensible Gun Control.
3	WHEREAS, recent tragedies have once again thrust into the national spotlight the
4	issue of accessibility of the general public to firearms; and
5	WHEREAS, two of the most recent of these horrific events were allegedly
6	perpetrated by young men who were only eighteen years of age; and
7	WHEREAS, many studies do not support the contention that "more guns lead to safer
8	communities" and instead, support the opposite conclusion; and
9	WHEREAS, firearms were the leading cause of death for children one year of age
10	and older for the first time in 2020, the most recent year for which data from the Centers for
11	Disease Control is available; and
12	WHEREAS, Louisiana consistently ranks in the top three in the nation for gun deaths
13	in the United States; and
14	WHEREAS, Louisiana is considered by gun control advocacy groups such as Moms
15	Demand Action as having lax gun laws, to the detriment of the citizens of Louisiana and to
16	the nation as a whole; and
17	WHEREAS, gun violence is a complex problem that must be met with a range of
18	solutions, including considerations of laws, policies, and programs designed to save lives
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1	and bring an end to this uniquely American epidemic.
2	THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Senate of the Legislature of Louisiana
3	does hereby establish and provide for the Task Force on Sensible Gun Control to study
4	common sense policies that would aid in stemming the epidemic of gun violence plaguing
5	our state and country, and to propose recommendations and specific proposals for
6	legislation, if any, by written report to the Senate and to the David R. Poynter Legislative
7	Research Library as required by R.S. 24:771 and 772, no later than February 15, 2023.
8	BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the task force should include consideration of
9	the following:
10	(1) The purpose and efficacy of firearm permitting.
11	(2) The purpose and efficacy of background checks, including the practicality and
12	effectiveness of expanding background checks to all firearm purchases and other transfers.
13	(3) The appropriate age for being able to possess and use a firearm.
14	(4) The purpose of possessing and using certain high-profile firearms, such as AR-15
15	and AK-47 platform rifles, and the effectiveness of limits on firearms magazine capacity.
16	(5) The efficacy and necessity for mandatory firearms safety training.
17	(6) The efficacy of extreme risk protection laws.
18	BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the task force shall consist of the following
19	members:
20	(1) The senator for Senate District 15, who shall serve as chairperson of the task
21	force.
22	(2) The executive director of the Louisiana District Attorneys Association, or his
23	designee.
24	(3) The state public defender, or his designee.
25	(4) A representative of the Louisiana Sheriffs' Association, appointed by the
26	executive director.
27	(5) A representative of the Louisiana Association of Chiefs of Police, appointed by
28	the president of the organization.
29	(6) The superintendent of the Louisiana State Police, or his designee.
30	(7) A representative of the Louisiana Chapter of Moms Demand Action, appointed

1	by the leader of the chapter.
2	(8) The president of the Louisiana Shooting Association, or his designee.
3	BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that each designating authority shall submit the
4	names of designees to the chairperson of the task force no later than August 1, 2022.
5	BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the study commission may conduct such
6	meetings at such times it may deem necessary or convenient to enable it to exercise fully and
7	effectively its powers, perform its duties, and accomplish the objectives and purposes of this
8	Resolution.
9	BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED the task force shall convene for its first meeting no
10	later than September 1, 2022, at the call of the chairperson, and at the first meeting the
11	members shall elect other officers as the task force may deem appropriate.
12	BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that a majority of the task force shall constitute a
13	quorum for the transaction of business, and all official actions of the task force shall require
14	the affirmative vote of a majority of the members.
15	BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the members of the task force shall serve
16	without compensation, except per diem or expenses reimbursement to which they may be
17	individually entitled as members of their constituent organizations.
18	BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the task force shall receive staff support from
19	one or more of the entities from which the task force's membership is designated or
20	appointed, at the discretion of the task force.
21	BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the task force shall terminate on the date of the
22	submission of its report or February 15, 2023, whichever occurs first.
23	BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that a copy of this Resolution be transmitted to the
24	Louisiana District Attorneys Association, the state public defender, the Louisiana Sheriffs'
25	Association, the Louisiana Association of Chiefs of Police, the superintendent of Louisiana
26	State Police, the Louisiana Chapter of Moms Demand Action, and the Louisiana Shooting

27 Association.

## DIGEST 2022 Regular Session

Barrow

Creates the Task Force on Sensible Gun Control to study common sense policies that would aid in stemming the epidemic of gun violence plaguing our state and country, and to propose recommendations and specific proposals for legislation, if any, by written report no later than February 15, 2023.

Provides that the task force will consist of the following members:

- (1) The senator for Senate District 15, who shall serve as chairperson of the task force.
- (2) The executive director of the La. District Attorneys Association, or his designee.
- (3) The state public defender, or his designee.
- (4) A representative of the La. Sheriffs' Association, appointed by the executive director.
- (5) A representative of the La. Association of Chiefs of Police, appointed by the president of the organization.
- (6) The superintendent of La. State Police, or his designee.
- (7) A representative of the La. Chapter of Moms Demand Action, appointed by the leader of the chapter.
- (8) The president of the La. Shooting Association, or his designee.

Provides relative to meetings of the task force, election of officers, quorum, voting, and staffing.

Provides that the task force is to make a written report of its finding and recommendations by February 15, 2023.
