WHEREAS, President Jimmy Carter proclaimed the first National Grandparents Day in 1978; and

WHEREAS, though some grandparents live with their families and others choose to live in their own homes or retirement villages, grandparents have a special place of honor in their family and should be remembered often, especially on their own special day.

THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Senate of the Legislature of Louisiana does hereby proclaim April 27, 2010, as Grandparents Day at the Louisiana State Capitol.
