4	upon his death in combat in Operation Iraqi Freedom.
5	WHEREAS, Major Ronald Wayne Culver Jr., was a native of Shreveport, Louisiana,
6	and the executive officer of the 2 <sup>nd</sup> Squadron, 108 <sup>th</sup> Cavalry, 256 <sup>th</sup> Infantry Brigade Combat
7	Team, based in Shreveport; and
8	WHEREAS, Major Culver was a Louisiana native and a graduate of Louisiana State
9	University-Shreveport, as well as a veteran of twenty-two years in the Army National Guard;

11	WHEREAS, he was well known to many in north Louisiana through his work with
12	the guard and his going to war with the 1st Battalion, 156th Infantry Regiment in Operation
13	Iraqi Freedom during the unit's 2004-2005 combat deployment; and
14	WHEREAS, Major Culver was known by his men as a leader who could be counted
15	on in a crisis when he and his unit were thrown into hurricane relief efforts after hurricanes
16	Katrina and Rita had devastated Louisiana; and
17	WHEREAS, Major Culver was midway through his second tour in Iraq on Monday,
18	May 24, 2010, when the vehicle he was traveling in near Numaniyah was engaged by enemy

forces using an improvised explosive device, and he was mortally wounded; and

WHEREAS, Major Culver will live on in the hearts and minds of those whose lives he touched, but he will be especially missed by his wife, Tracy, and teen-aged children, Michelle Francis and Ronald Wayne III; and

WHEREAS, Major Culver will remain a source of undying love and tremendous pride to his parents, Betty and Ronald Wayne Culver Sr., of Shreveport.
