To express the sincere condolences of the Senate of the Legislature of Louisiana to the family of Louisiana Army National Guardsman Major Ronald Wayne Culver, Jr., upon his death in combat in Operation Iraqi Freedom.

WHEREAS, Major Ronald Wayne Culver Jr., was a native of Shreveport, Louisiana, and the executive officer of the 2<sup>nd</sup> Squadron, 108<sup>th</sup> Cavalry, 256<sup>th</sup> Infantry Brigade Combat Team, based in Shreveport; and

WHEREAS, Major Culver was a Louisiana native and a graduate of Louisiana State University-Shreveport, as well as a veteran of twenty-two years in the Army National Guard; and

WHEREAS, he was well known to many in north Louisiana through his work with the guard and his going to war with the 1<sup>st</sup> Battalion, 156<sup>th</sup> Infantry Regiment in Operation Iraqi Freedom during the unit's 2004-2005 combat deployment; and

WHEREAS, Major Culver was known by his men as a leader who could be counted on in a crisis when he and his unit were thrown into hurricane relief efforts after hurricanes Katrina and Rita had devastated Louisiana; and

WHEREAS, Major Culver was midway through his second tour in Iraq on Monday, May 24, 2010, when the vehicle he was traveling in near Numaniyah was engaged by enemy forces using an improvised explosive device, and he was mortally wounded; and

WHEREAS, Major Culver was known by his fellow soldiers as a good husband, a good father, and a good soldier, and he will be mourned and remembered especially as a good man; and

Global War on Terrorism Service Medal, the Iraq Campaign Medal, the Army Service

he touched, but he will be especially missed by his wife, Tracy, and teen-aged children,

Michelle Francis and Ronald Wayne III; and
