## A RESOLUTION

To recognize Wednesday, May 8, 2024, as "St. John the Baptist Parish Day" at the Louisiana State Capitol and to acknowledge Economic Development Week in St. John the Baptist Parish.

WHEREAS, this year St. John the Baptist Parish Day falls within Economic Development Week, acknowledging economic developers and the impact they have in attracting and growing businesses and promoting the economic well-being and quality of life for St. John the Baptist Parish; and

WHEREAS, St. John the Baptist Parish's economic base is supported by the petrochemical, grain, and steel industries; the Parish has a diverse labor force, a multi-modal transportation network, abundant raw materials, available land for residential, commercial

and industrial development, and the largest tonnage Port district in America; and
