**In the One Hundred and Ninety-First General Court
(2019-2020)**

An Act relative to insurance surcharges.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 SECTION 1. Section 113B of chapter 175 of the General Laws, as appearing in the 2016
2 Official Edition, is hereby amended by inserting after the word “incident” in line 227, the
3 following sentence:- “Driving a motor vehicle which has an expired inspection sticker shall not
4 be considered a surchargeable incident.”
