An Act relative to tuition for U.S. Veterans.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

- SECTION 1. Section 9 of Chapter 15A of the General Laws, as appearing in the 2008
- 2 Official Edition, is hereby amended by inserting after the word "tuition;" in line 128, the
- 3 following words:-
- 4 "provided, however, that any veteran of the United States armed services shall be
- 5 considered Massachusetts residents for the purpose of admission and tuition expenses for any
- 6 Massachusetts state college, community college, or state university under the following
- 7 conditions: the veteran was honorably discharged from the U.S. armed services after at least one
- 8 year of active service, excluding time spent at a military service academy; the veteran designates
- 9 Massachusetts as his/her intended domicile, moves to Massachusetts for the purpose of
- 10 establishing residency, and successfully establishes residency in Massachusetts within one year
- of matriculation in a Massachusetts public institution of higher learning; failure to successfully
- 12 meet any of the conditions will result in the Massachusetts state college, community college, or
