An Act relative to public housing restrictions.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

- 1 SECTION 1. Section 32 of chapter 121B of the General Laws, as appearing in the 2010 2 Official Edition, is hereby amended by adding the following paragraph:-
- Notwithstanding any general or special law or regulation to the contrary, an applicant for
- 4 assisted housing under this chapter who is not eligible for federal assisted housing under 42
- 5 U.S.C. section 1436a, and who is not a person residing in the United States as defined in
- 6 regulations of the federal Department of Health and Human Services, shall not displace or be
- 7 given priority over any applicant who is so eligible.
