**In the Year Two Thousand Thirteen**

An Act relative to victim notification .

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:*

1           SECTION 1   Section 3 of chapter 258B of the general laws is hereby further amended  
2 by inserting, at the end thereof, the following new subsections:-

4    (aa) for victims, to be notified by the prosecutor that they have the right to provide the sex  
5 offender registry board with a written impact statement for inclusion in the convicted sex  
6 offender’s classification determination pursuant to section 178K(1)(k) of chapter 6. Upon the  
7 specific request of the victim to the sex offender registry board, the board shall inform the victim  
8 of the sex offender’s (i) registration and classification status and (ii) the addresses of where the  
9 sex offender lives, works, and attends an institution of higher learning regardless of the  
10 classification level and registration status of the offender
