An Act relative to limiting recurring parole hearings for persons convicted of second degree murder.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:*

1 SECTION 1. This act shall be known and referred to as “Leslie’s Law”.

2 SECTION 2. Section 133A of chapter 127 of the General Laws, as appearing in the 2012  
3 Official Edition, is hereby amended by inserting after the word “period”, in line 48, the following  
4 words: - provided, however, that for any person convicted of murder in the second degree, such  
5 ensuing period shall be 10 years.
