An Act to recognize common law marriage in the Commonwealth .

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:*

1 Chapter 207 § 59

2 Persons cohabiting and acknowledging each other as spouse, and generally reputed to be  
3 such, for 3 years shall thereafter be deemed to have been legally married.

4 Nothing in this chapter shall be construed to render any common-law marriage, otherwise  
5 lawful, invalid by reason of the failure to take out a license or follow solemnization procedures  
6 as provided by this chapter.
