By Mr. Jones of North Reading, a petition (accompanied by bill, House, No. 125) of Bradley H. Jones, Jr. and others for legislation to establish a commission to study and report on the safety and privacy concerns of telemedicine systems. Advanced Information Technology, the Internet and Cybersecurity.

The Commonwealth of Massachusetts

In the One Hundred and Ninety-Second General Court (2021-2022)

An Act relative to the promotion of secure telehealth systems.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 SECTION 1. Notwithstanding any general or special laws to the contrary, there shall be 2 established a commission to study and report on the safety and privacy concerns of telemedicine 3 systems for the purpose of ensuring safe use by providers and patients, and to promote the secure 4 use and expansion of telemedicine systems.

5 The commission shall (1) identify risks posed to consumers by telemedicine systems such 6 as the breach of personal data; (2) review and identify gaps in the current regulatory framework 7 and security principles governing telemedicine in Massachusetts; (3) evaluate the effectiveness 8 of privacy and risk management laws in place to protect providers and consumers utilizing 9 telehealth systems and services; (4) identify outdated state policies and regulations that prevent 10 the growth and use of telemedicine systems; (5) issue recommendations regarding how to improve state security policies concerning the use of telemedicine systems by providers and 11 12 patients; and (6) issue recommendations concerning policies that may need to be changed or

updated in order to promote the secure use and expansion of telemedicine services inMassachusetts.

15 The commission shall consist of the chairs of the joint committee on economic 16 development and emerging technologies or designees, who shall serve as the co chairs; the 17 speaker of the house of representatives or a designee; the president of the senate or a designee; 18 the house minority leader or a designee; the senate minority leader or a designee; the chairs of 19 the joint committee on public health or designees; the chair of the house committee on 20 technology and intergovernmental affairs or a designee; the executive director of the 21 Massachusetts health policy commission or a designee; and the secretary of the executive office 22 of health and human services or a designee.

The commission shall submit a final report with its findings regarding the security policies governing telemedicine systems, along with any recommendations regarding how to establish a strong security framework governing telemedicine and update policies to allow for its expansion, to the house and senate clerks, the chairs of the joint committee on economic development and emerging technologies, and the chairs of the joint committee on public health, by December 31, 2021.

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
