The Commonwealth of Massachusetts

In the One Hundred and Ninety-First General Court (2019-2020)

An Act relative to foster care recruitment.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 Notwithstanding any general or special law to the contrary, the department of children 2 and families (DCF) shall investigate and report on the feasibility and best practices of launching 3 an organized and focused foster parent recruitment campaign. As part of its report, DCF shall 4 include, but not be limited to, information on the costs associated with such a recruitment effort, information on current recruitment practices, current costs of recruitment, and difficulties 5 6 impeding DCF's ability to recruit additional foster parents. DCF shall file its report with the 7 chairs of the joint committee on children, families and persons with disabilities, as well as with 8 the clerks of the house and senate, no later than July 1, 2019.
