Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

- Chapter 111 of the General Laws, as appearing in the 2016 Official Edition is hereby
- 4 amended by inserting at the end thereof the following new section:-
- 5 Section X. Any properly licensed person, under the jurisdiction of a publicly recognized
- 6 organization, and/or any individual person in good faith in a private legally registered insured
- 7 vehicle, to voluntarily transport any needy person(s) to a designated destination and return.
- 8 Doing so without compensation except for tolls, parking, shall not be liable for acts of omissions
- 9 causing harm, other than gross negligence or willful or wanton misconduct, resulting from
- 10 transport of such person(s)
