## The Commonwealth of Massachusetts

In the One Hundred and Ninety-Second General Court (2021-2022)

An Act supporting urgent community college equity through student services.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:* 

1	<b>SECTION 1 Chapte</b>	15A of the Massachusetts	General Laws is hereby	y amended by

2 inserting the following new section: -

3 Section XX: It is hereby declared to be the policy of the commonwealth to support

4 community college student success through wraparound supports and services to improve

5 outcomes for students through a grant program to be known as the Supporting Urgent

6 Community College Equity through Student Services program, hereinafter referred to as the

7 SUCCESS program.

8 Subject to appropriation, the SUCCESS program shall provide grants to community

9 colleges to provide wraparound supports and services to improve outcomes for the most

10 vulnerable student populations including, but not limited to, low-income, first generation,

minority, and disabled students and lesbian, gay, bisexual, transgender, queer, and questioning
students.

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In conjunction with the Massachusetts Association of Community Colleges, the department of higher education shall report to the joint committee on higher education and the house and senate committees on ways and means on the success of students supported by the fund, including any regulations, guidelines, or criteria used to distribute the funds, and on the final distribution of funds to campuses; and provided further, that funds appropriated for this item shall not revert but shall be made available for this item in future fiscal years.

SECTION 2. Chapter 29 of the General Laws is hereby amended by inserting after
 section 2CCCCC the following section: -

21 Section 2SSSSS. (a) There is hereby established and set up on the books of the 22 Commonwealth a separate fund to be known as the Supporting Urgent Community College 23 Equity through Student Services Trust Fund, hereinafter referred to as the SUCCESS Fund, to 24 which shall be credited any appropriations, bond proceeds or other monies authorized by the 25 general court and specifically designated to be credited thereto. Bunker Hill Community 26 College, hereinafter referred to as the college, shall hold the SUCCESS Fund in an account or 27 accounts separate from other funds or accounts; provided, that the SUCCESS Fund shall be 28 administered by the Massachusetts Association of Community Colleges. Amounts credited to the 29 fund shall be used by the college to carry out the purposes of the fund as set forth in this section. 30 Any monies unexpended at the end of the fiscal year shall remain in the fund and may be 31 expended by the college without further appropriation.

32 (b) The fund shall be used for wraparound support activities including, but not be limited
33 to, peer mentors, academic skills workshops, field trips to 4-year schools, and targeted academic,
34 career, transfer, and scholarship advising.

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35 (d) The funds shall be disbursed based on a formula and criteria developed by the
36 Massachusetts Association of Community Colleges in coordination with the Department of
37 Higher Education.

(e) In conjunction with the Massachusetts Association of Community Colleges, the
department of higher education shall report to the joint committee on higher education and the
house and senate committees on ways and means on the success of students supported by the
fund, including any regulations, guidelines, or criteria used to distribute the funds, and on the
final distribution of funds to campuses.
