The Commonwealth of Massachusetts

In the Year Two Thousand Eleven

An Act relative to enforcement of the victims' bill of rights.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 SECTION 1. Section 3 of Chapter 258B of the General Laws, as appearing in the 2008 Official
2 Edition, is hereby amended by inserting the following:

3 (w) Any crime victim or the crime victim's lawful representative, and or the attorney for the
4 government, may assert the rights described in this chapter.

5 In a case where the court finds that the number of crime victims makes it impracticable to accord
6 all of the crime victims the rights described in this chapter, the court shall fashion a reasonable
7 procedure to give effect to this chapter that does not unduly complicate or prolong the
8 proceedings.

9 The rights described in this chapter shall be asserted in the court in which a defendant is being
10 prosecuted for the crime or, if no prosecution is underway, in a district or superior court in the
11 county in which the crime occurred. The court shall take up and decide any motion asserting a

12 victim's right forthwith. If the court denies the relief sought, the Movant may file a petition for
13 relief with the Single Justice of the Supreme Judicial Court under M.G.L. Chapter 211, §3. The
14 Single Justice shall take up and decide such application forthwith within 72 hours after the
15 petition has been filed. If relief is denied, the reasons for the denial shall be clearly stated on the
16 record in a written opinion and Movant may file for further relief consistent with existing rules of
17 appellate procedure.

18 In any appeal in a criminal case, the government may assert as error any court's denial of any
19 crime victim's right in the proceeding to which the appeal relates.
