**In the One Hundred and Eighty-Ninth General Court
(2015-2016)**

An Act relative to marketing prioritized development sites.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 SECTION 1. Chapter 23A of the General Laws, as appearing in 2012 official edition, is
2 hereby amended by adding after section 64 the following section:-

3 Section 65. The Massachusetts office of business development shall, itself or in
4 partnership with an external entity, create and maintain a searchable public online database of
5 sites available for development in municipalities across the state. The Massachusetts office of
6 business development shall accept site submissions for inclusion into the database from
7 municipal officials or their designees, at no cost to the municipality.
