## The Commonwealth of Massachusetts

In the Year Two Thousand Eleven

An Act related to personnel records.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:*

1 SECTION 1. Section 52C of Chapter 149 of the General Laws, as amended by Section 148 of  
2 Chapter 240 of the Acts of 2010, is hereby amended by striking out the fifth paragraph and  
3 inserting in place thereof the following paragraph:-

4 Any employer receiving a written request from an employee shall provide the employee with an  
5 opportunity to review his personnel record within five business days of such request. The review  
6 shall take place at the place of employment and during normal business hours. An employee  
7 shall be given a copy of his personnel record within five business days of submission of a written  
8 request for such copy to his employer.
