AN ACT RELATIVE TO HEALTH CARE PROXIES.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

- SECTION 1. Section 4 of chapter 201D, as appearing in the 2006 Official Edition, is hereby
- 2 amended by inserting, in line 6, after the word "authority", the following:— including but not
- 3 limited to any express direction the principal wishes to impose upon the agent
- 4 SECTION 2. Section 5 of said chapter 201D, as so appearing, is hereby amended by striking the
- 5 sentence, in lines 1 through 4, inclusive, "An agent shall have the authority to make any and all
- 6 health care decisions on the principal's behalf that the principal could make, including decisions
- about life-sustaining treatment, subject, however, to any express limitations in the health care
- 8 proxy." and inserting in place thereof the following sentence:-
- 9 An agent shall have the authority to make any and all health care decisions on the principal's
- behalf that the principal could make, including decisions about life-sustaining treatment, subject,
- 11 however, to any express limitations or directives in the health care proxy, which shall be binding
- 12 upon the agent.
