The Commonwealth of Massachusetts

In the One Hundred and Ninety-Third General Court (2023-2024)

An Act relative to the reckless evasion of a police officer.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 SECTION 1. Chapter 90 of the General Laws, as appearing in the 2016 Official Edition,

2 is hereby amended by inserting after section 25 the following section:-

3 Section 25A. Any person who flees or attempts to elude a police officer while operating a 4 motor vehicle willfully or with a wanton disregard for the safety of persons or property, shall be 5 punished by a fine of not less than one hundred dollars and not more than one thousand dollars or 6 by imprisonment for not less than six months and not more than two years, or both. A conviction 7 under this provision shall result in a driver's license suspension by the registry of motor vehicles 8 for 60 days. For the purposes of this section, willful or wanton disregard for the safety of persons 9 or property includes, but is not limited to, driving while fleeing or attempting to elude a pursuing

- 10 police officer during which time the driver causes property damage or makes three or more
- 11 moving violations.
