#### The Commonwealth of Massachusetts

In the One Hundred and Eighty-Ninth General Court (2015-2016)

An Act relative to jury disqualifications.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

- 1 Section 4 of chapter 234A of the General Laws, as appearing in the 2012 Official Edition,
- 2 is hereby amended by adding the following paragraph:-
- 9. Such person is legally blind and indicates on the juror confirmation form an election
- 4 not to perform juror service. For purposes of this section "legally blind" shall mean a condition
- 5 associated with a finding by a physician or optometrist that a person has a visual acuity of 20/200
- 6 or less with correction in the better eye, or has a peripheral visual field of 10 degrees radius or
- 7 less regardless of visual acuity.
