#### The Commonwealth of Massachusetts

In the One Hundred and Ninety-Third General Court (2023-2024)

An Act relative to aggressive panhandling on or adjacent to public ways.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

- 1 Chapter 272 of the General Laws is hereby amended by inserting after section 67 the
- 2 following section:-
- 3 Section 67A. A person begging, or panhandling, to receive funds or alms: (i) within 20
- 4 feet of a public way; and (ii) in a manner that is disorderly or disturbing, or which involves
- 5 profane, obscene or indecent language or behavior, may be punished by no more than 3 months
- 6 in the house of correction.
