An Act relative to veterans...

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

- 1 SECTION 1. Paragraph (h) of subdivision (1) of section 4 of said chapter 32, as
- 2 appearing in the 2006 Official Edition, is hereby amended by adding the following
- 3 paragraph: Notwithstanding the provisions of this chapter or any other general or special law,
- 4 rule or regulation to the contrary, a member retired prior to April 1996, in a retirement system as
- 5 defined in section one who is a veteran, as defined Chapter 4 section 7, who served in the armed
- 6 forces of the United States shall be entitled to credit for active service in the armed services of
- 7 the United States; provided that such creditable service shall not be construed to include service
- 8 for more than four years provided further, that such creditable service shall not be allowed for

- 9 any period of active service for which said veteran has received credit pursuant to paragraph (h)
- 10 of subsection (1) of section 4 of chapter thirty-two of the General Laws or for which said veteran
- 11 receives a federal military pension and provided further, that the amount does not exceed the
- 12 eighty percent allowed to retire. This act shall apply to Massachusetts National Guard and Active
- 13 Reserve personnel, both former and present. Creditable service time, both enlisted and
- 14 commissioned may be applied toward retirement on a ratio of five years guard service or five
- 15 years active reserve service substitutable for each year of active service.
- 16 SECTION 2. For the retirement system of any political subdivision, the provisions
- 17 of this act shall take effect on the effective date of this act by majority vote of the board of such
- 18 system and by the local legislative body. For the purposes of this paragraph local
- 19 Legislative body shall mean a town meeting for a town system, the city council subject to the
- 20 provisions of its charter for a city system, the county commissioners for a county system, the
- 21 district members for a district system and the governing body of an authority for an authority
- 22 system. Acceptance shall be deemed to have occurred upon the filing of a certification of 160
- 23 Chap. 71 such vote with the commissioner. Members retired prior to April 1996 of a retirement
- 24 system eligible for said creditable service under this act shall become eligible for said creditable
- 25 service the month following the acceptance of this act by the local legislative body. Terms used
- 26 in this act shall have the same meaning as those terms defined in section one of chapter thirty-
- 27 two of the General Laws.
